The NoVaMigra consortium of several European universities is conducting a research project aimed at understanding the current “value crisis” in Europe, assess possible evolution of European values, and consider Europe’s future in light of rights, norms, and values. As part of the project, we are planning an edited volume tentatively entitled *Migration, Asylum, Value Practices, and Value Agents*. The volume will be edited by Elzbieta Gozdzia, Izabella Main and Brigitte Suter of Malmö and Adam Mickiewicz University, respectively. The editors are seeking authors from the field of social sciences and/or humanities to write one chapter each on value practices and value agents working on refugee and immigrant integration in France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Netherlands, Poland, and Sweden. The chapters should be based on the analysis of mission statements, statutes, programme descriptions, and press coverage of different organisations and institutions (e.g., national and local governmental integration programmes as well as programmes organised by schools and civil society actors such as sports clubs, girl and boy scouts, community-based organisations, and other non-governmental entities) and if necessary, interviews with leaders and members of such groups.

If interested in contributing a chapter, please send an abstract of 300-500 words and a copy of your cv to Elzbieta M. Gozdzia at emg27@amu.edu.pl by June 1, 2018.

A more detailed exposé for the book will be distributed at the end of June 2018. Draft chapters are due at the end of December 2018. The authors will be invited to participate in the workshop of the NoVaMigra team on March 7-8, 2019 in Poznan, Poland where they will have the opportunity to present their chapters and receive feedback from the editors and the NoVaMigra team.
